**MAXIMUM OF 90,000 POUNDS GROSS VEHICLE WEIGHT WITH A MINIMUM OF 5 AXLES NOT TO EXCEED 20,000 POUND PER AXLE LIMIT. THIS PERMIT IS VALID FOR THE DURATION OF EXECUTIVE ORDER 20-01D
 THIS MAY BE A DIVISIBLE LOAD AND THE NON-DIVISIBLE LOAD STATEMENT DOES NOT APPLY TO THIS LOAD OR MOVE.
 THIS MUST BE A NON-DIVISIBLE LOAD IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 5501:2-1-01 OF THE OHIO ADMINISTRATIVE CODE.
 --MAXIMUM PERMITTED SPEED MAY NOT EXCEED 55 MPH.--**

This permit is issued as an 'Emergency permit' and is authorized for movement when necessitated by any occurrence which causes or threatens to cause the loss of life or otherwise endangers public health, safety or welfare. Movement at night is authorized provided that proper lighting is used during night time travel. Curfew and Holiday provisions do not apply to this permit. The permittee is authorized to exit the permitted route at any State Highway intersection for food, fuel, rest, or repair provided that the hauler does not travel more than 5,280 feet (1 mile) from the interchange (measured as a lane mile from the junction of the off ramp) and does not cross under (if permitted height exceeds 13 feet 6 inches) or over any structure (structure is defined as anything 10 feet wide or greater). When re-entering the permitted route, the permittee must abide by the same restrictions as when exiting the permitted route. By traveling more than 5,280 feet (1 mile) or crossing over or under (if permitted height exceeds 13 feet 6 inches) any structure the permittee will be considered off route. In the event that the permittee travels beyond the one mile limit, crosses a structure within the one mile variance, or violates any other provision of the permit, the permittee is in violation and subject to applicable fines and penalties. The permittee should have the ability to see the facility where they are stopping from the permitted route. ODOT recommends that the permittee familiarize themselves with the various exits and entrances they may choose. The Human trafficking page of this permit is not a part of the valid permit and as such enforcement should not be taken for not having that page. All other requirements remain.


This permit does not apply to posted bridges, and local highways with special and seasonal weight limit postings. This permit does not exempt the trucks and their load from the size requirements of Ohio Revised Code section 5577.05. A copy of this Permit and a Bill of Lading must be in the possession of the operator during the progress of the movement and shall be available for inspection upon request to any law enforcement officer or any authorized employee of the Ohio Department of Transportation or the Public Utilities Commission of Ohio. All trucking companies must file the route taken by each truck with the Ohio Department of Transportation, Division of Permits within 24 hours after completion of each movement. Permission to travel county or township roads, local streets not part of the State Route, or the Ohio Turnpike must be obtained from the proper authorities. All Permitted Loads Must Stop At All Weigh Stations Regardless of In-Cab Transponder Signal.

Be an Everyday Hero! Help end human trafficking!

Slavery has been illegal for centuries, but **human trafficking has created more slaves today than ever before**. It's happening to our own children in all 50 states and DC, along most of our highways and in locations including truck stops, motels/hotels, strip clubs, private homes, rest areas, etc. Traffickers control their victims through force, fraud and coercion. **Any minor engaged in commercial sex is a victim of human trafficking**. If you see a minor working any of these areas or suspect the person selling sex is under someone's control to make a quota, **make a call and save lives**.

**If you suspect you're seeing human trafficking,
call 911 and the National Human Trafficking Hotline at 1-888-3737-888 (US)
or text INFO or HELP to BeFree (233733)**

Calls to the hotline can be anonymous. Provide descriptions of cars and people involved, specific times and dates, addresses and locations where the suspicious activity took place.

Red Flags to look for:

- Does the victim know her/his whereabouts and have control of own ID/passport?
- Is there restricted or controlled communication – victim not allowed to speak for self?
- Have you heard CB chatter about "commercial company" or flashing lights signaling "buyer" location?
- Is there acknowledgement of a pimp and making a quota?
- Are there signs of branding or tattooing of a trafficker's name (often on the neck)?
- Does a van or RV seem out of place back by trucks; a vehicle dropping someone off at a truck and returning 15–20 minutes later for pick-up of a person?

Remember:

Don't approach traffickers. Allow law enforcement to deal with traffickers and recover victims. Approaching traffickers is dangerous for you and the victims. Also, anyone using their CMV to commit a felony involving a severe form of human trafficking will receive a lifetime CDL ban. All 50 states and DC have a law criminalizing sex trafficking. Some states punish purchasers the same as sex traffickers, and 31 states have a buyer-applicable trafficking law prohibiting mistake-of-age defense in prosecutions for buying a commercial sex act with any minor under 18.
