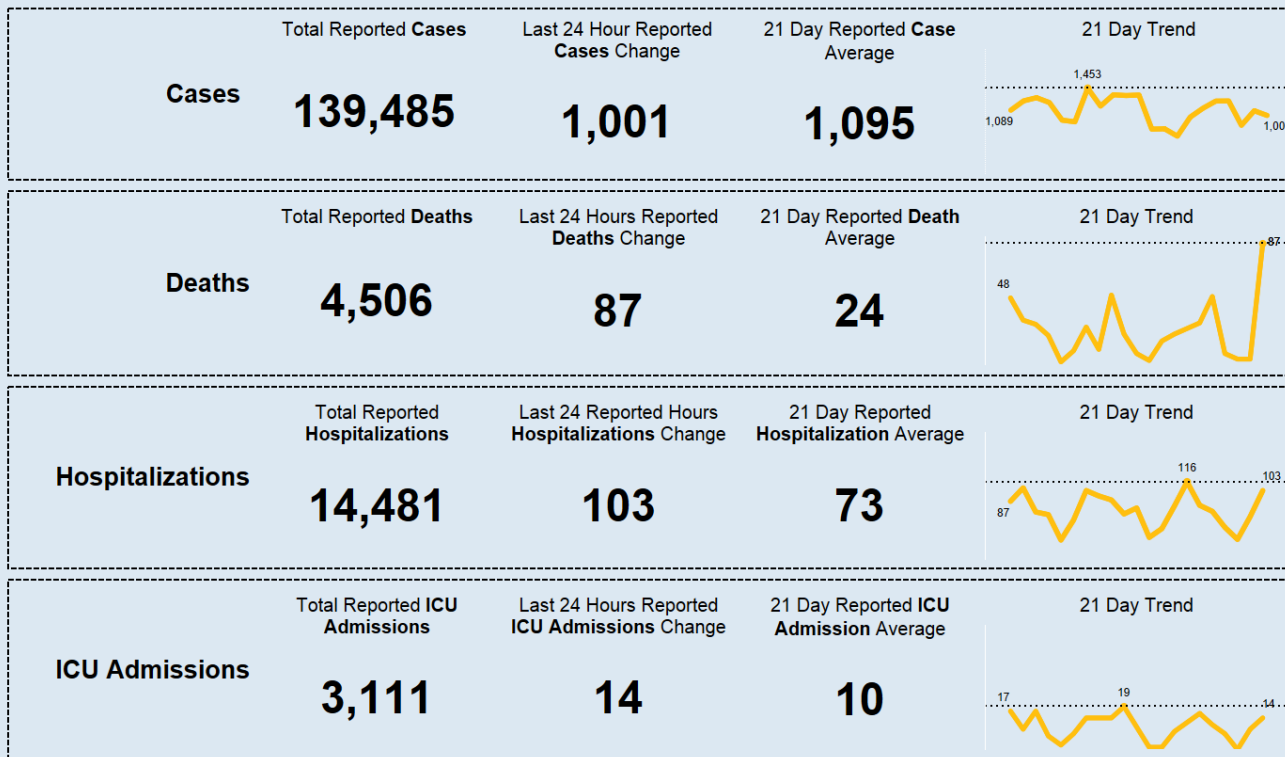

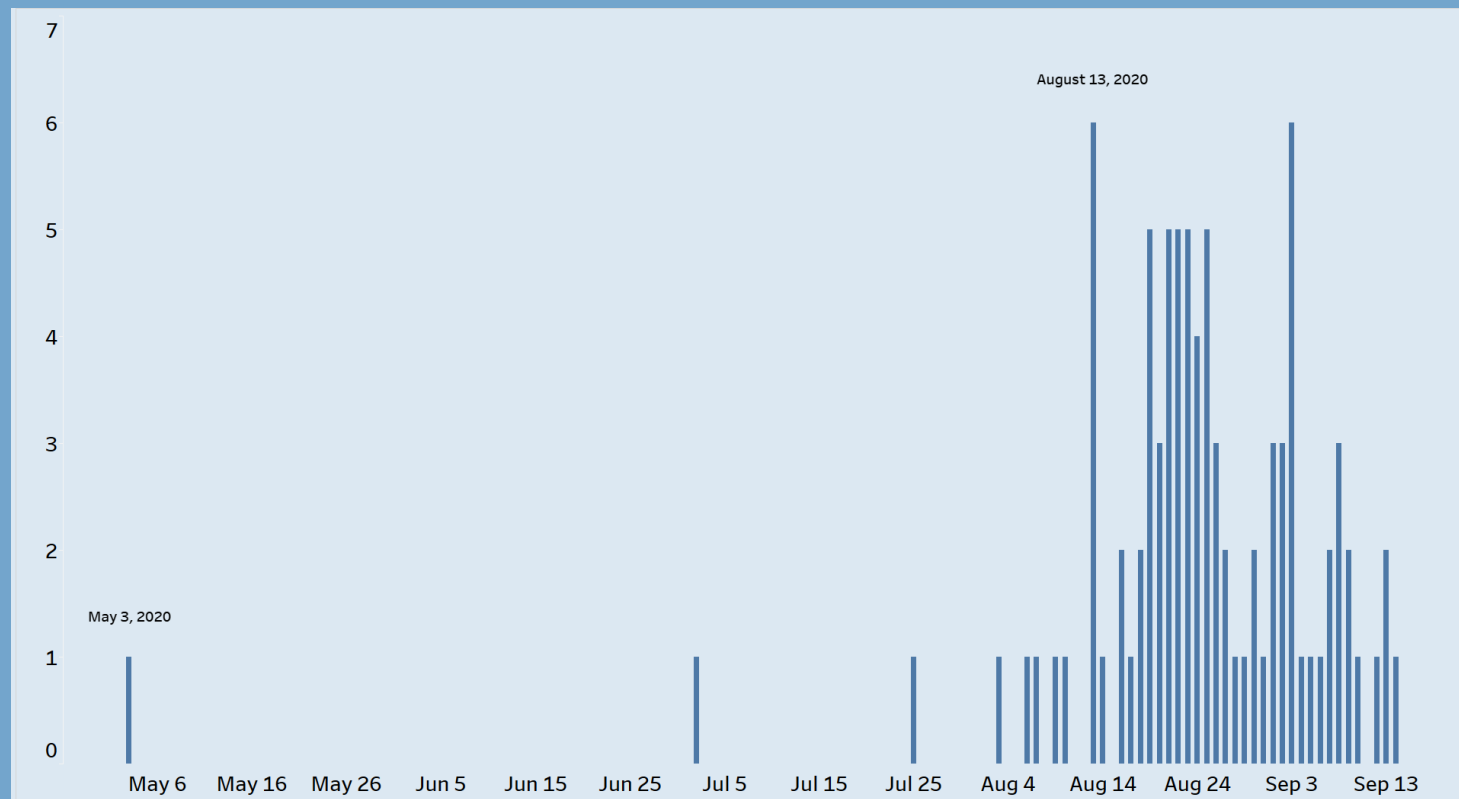

COVID-19 | Deaths Reported in Last 24 Hours by Date of Death

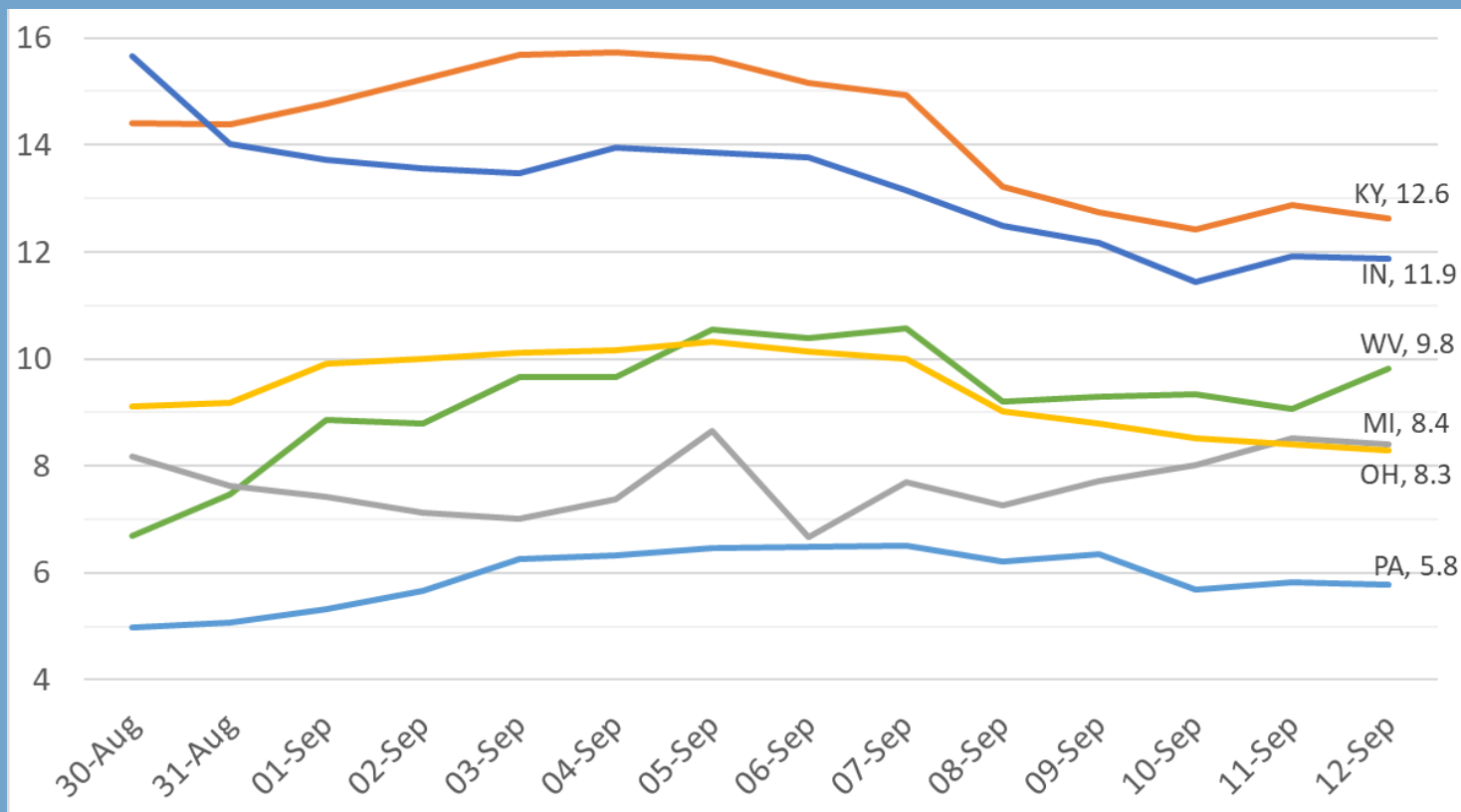

COVID-19 | Cases per 100,000 Population by State

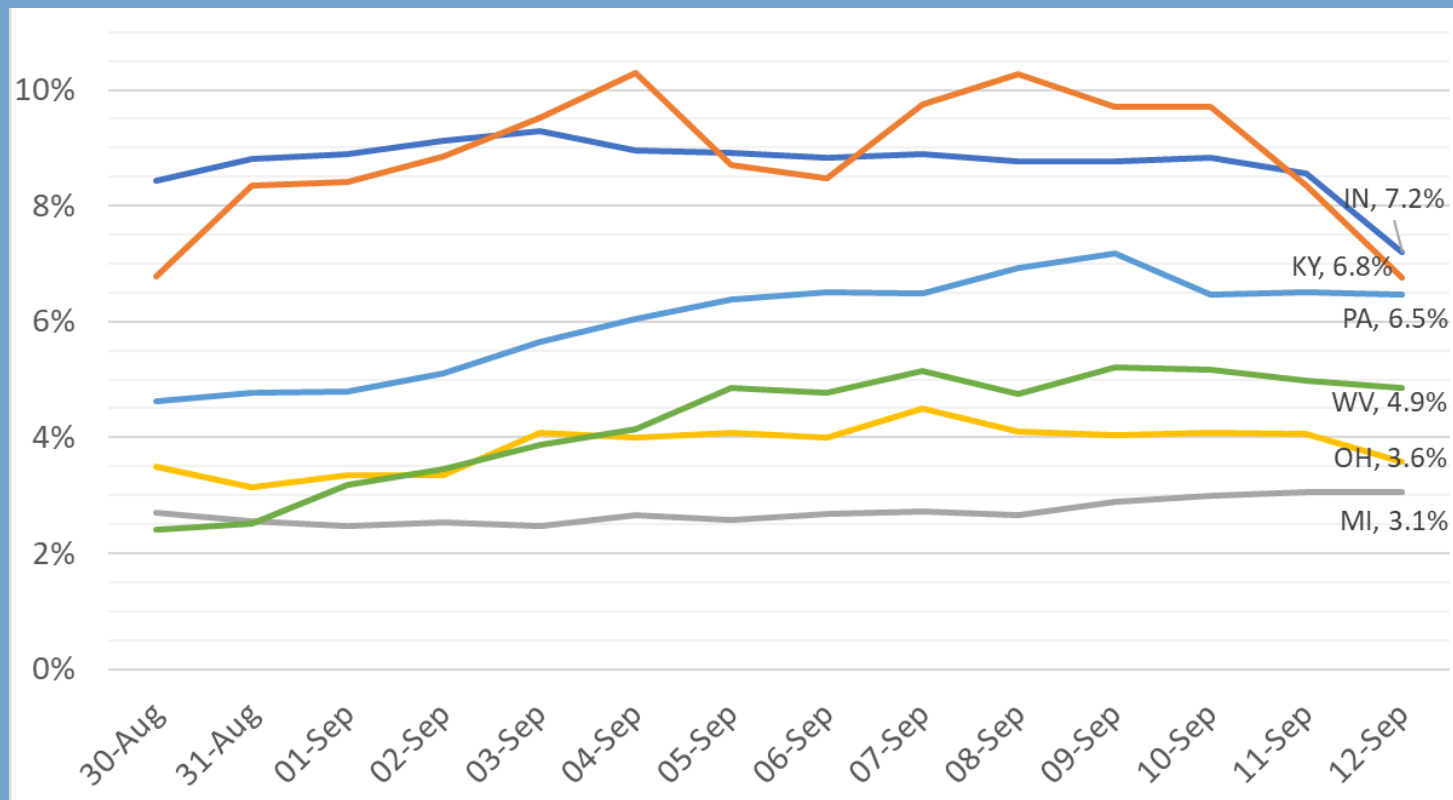

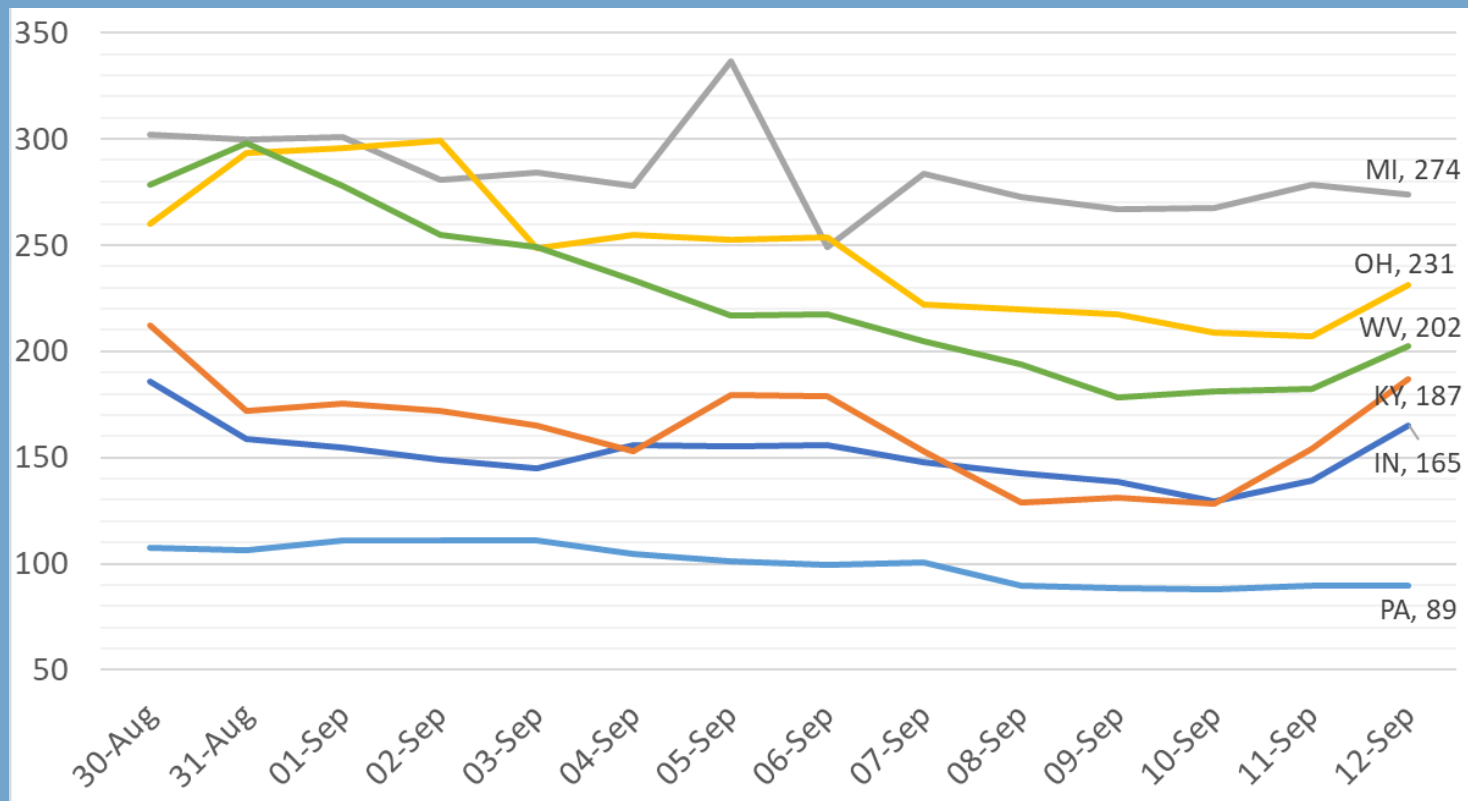
