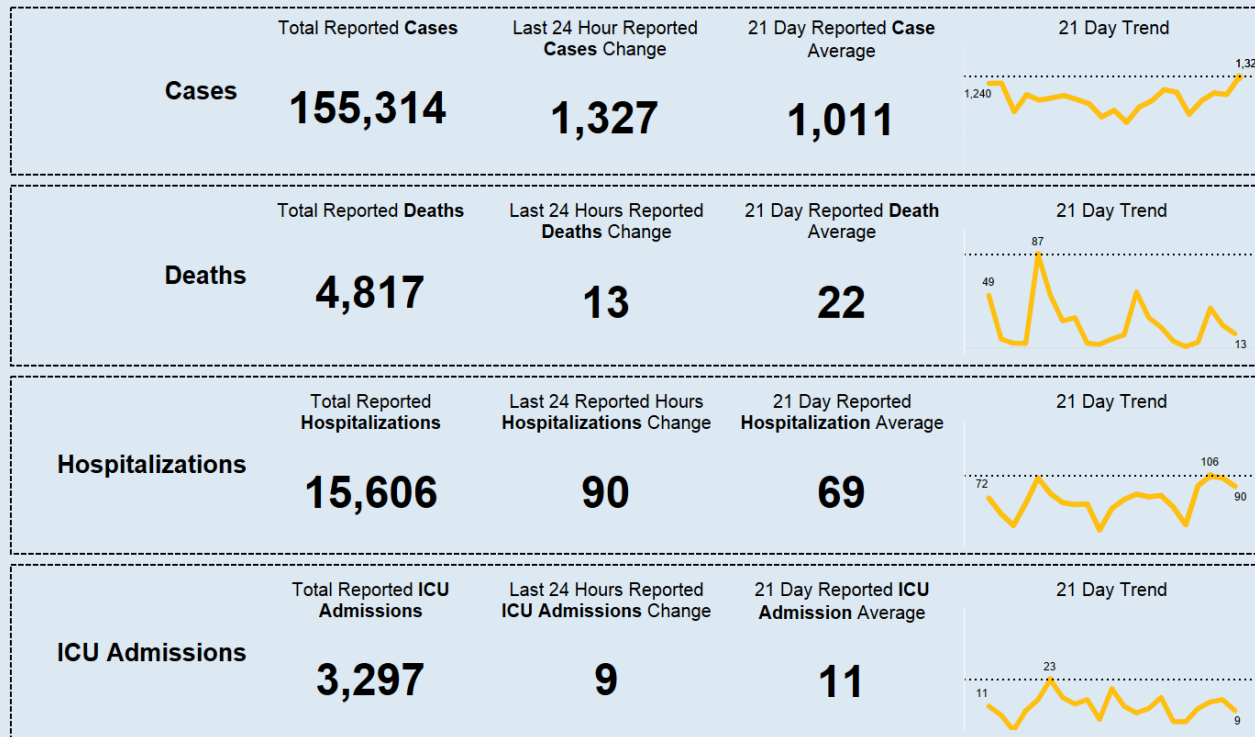


COVID - 19 | Key Indicators

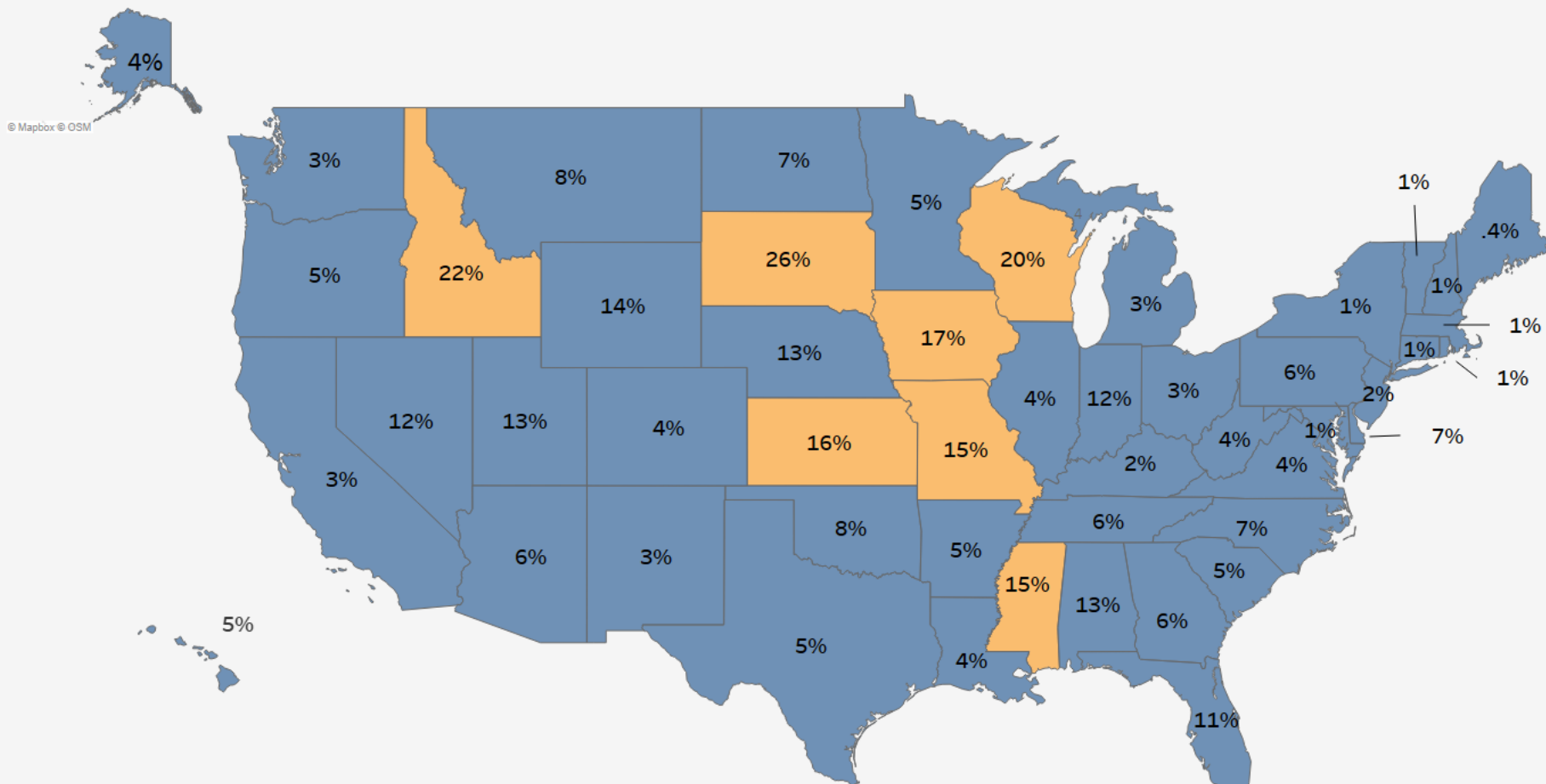

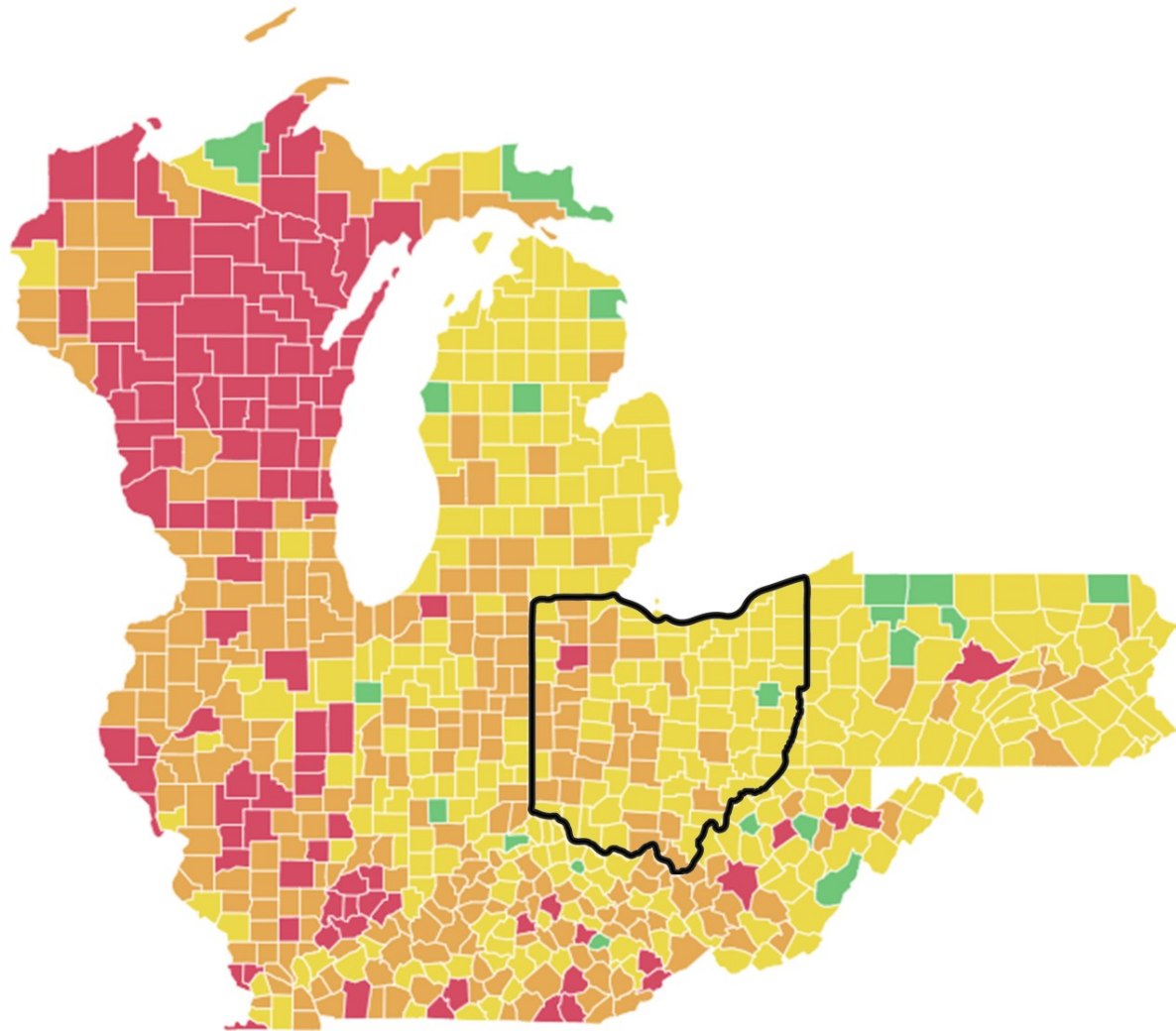
Positivity Rate **Over** and **Under** 15% by State

LEVEL 3

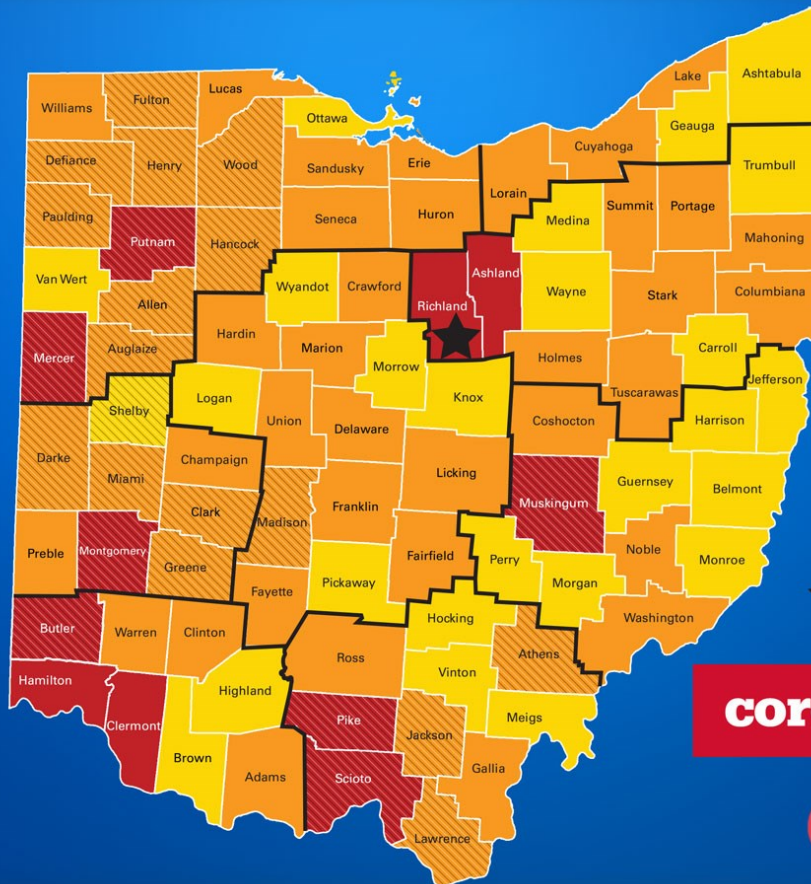
Public Emergency
