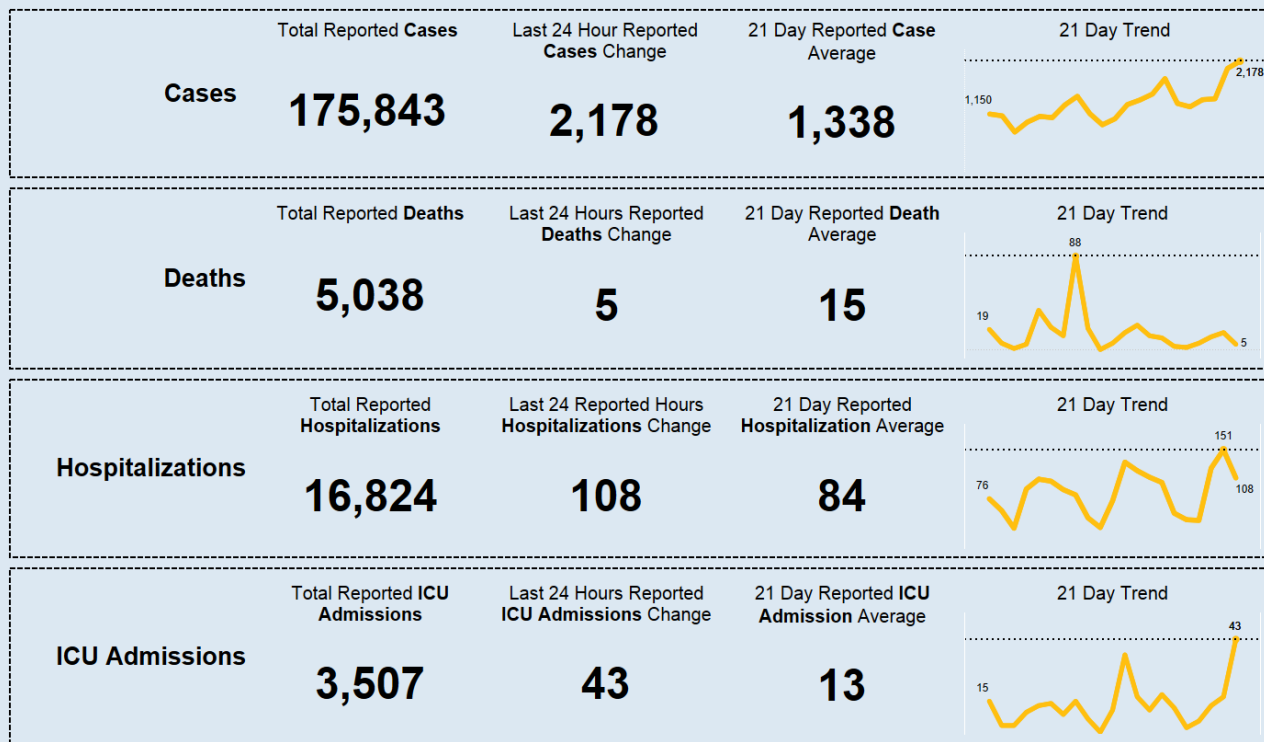


COVID - 19 | Key Indicators

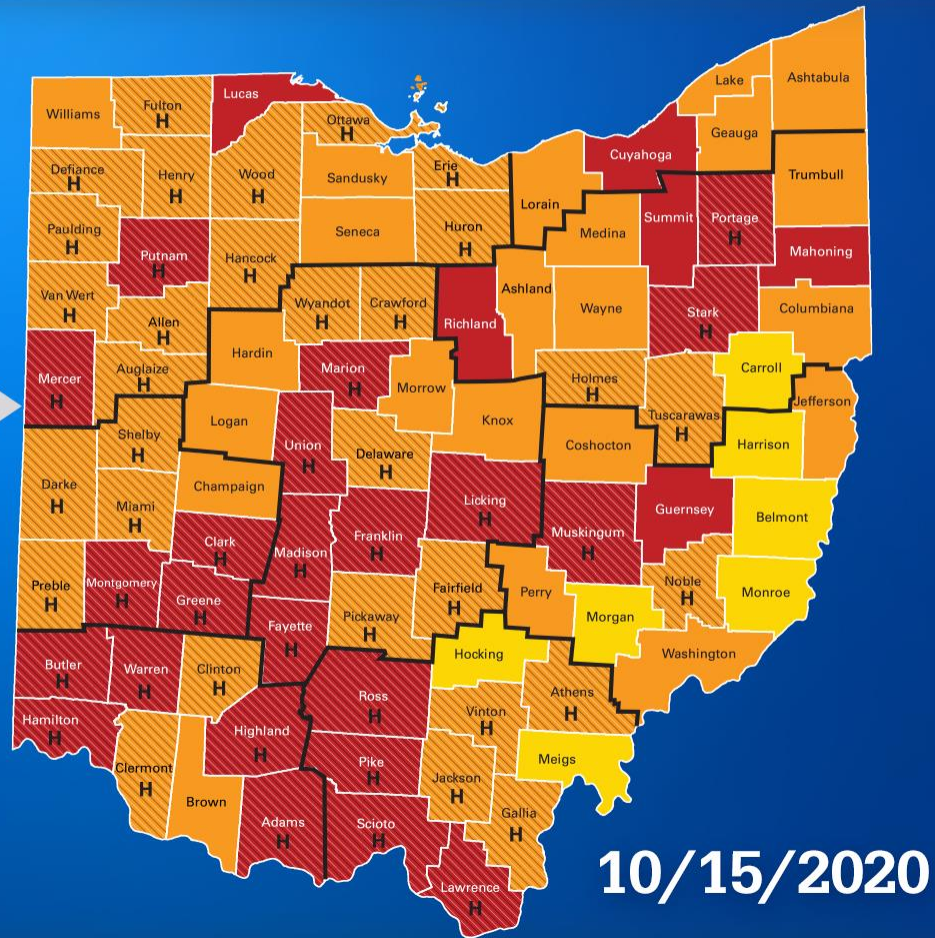
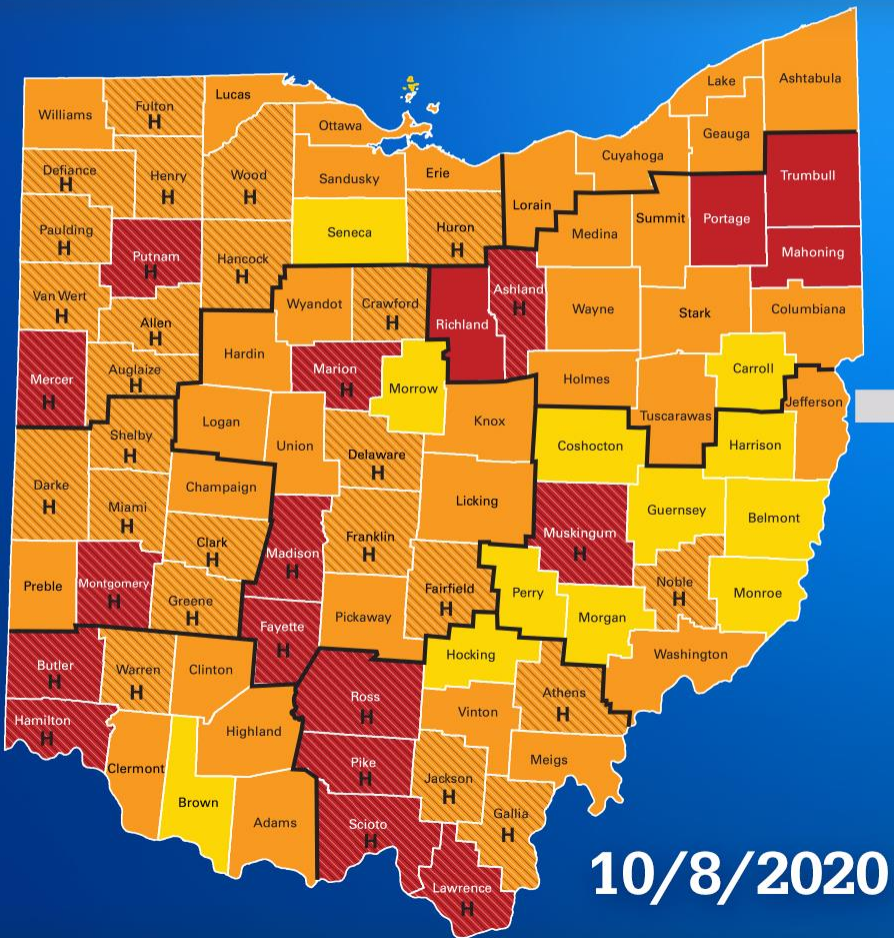

LEVEL 3

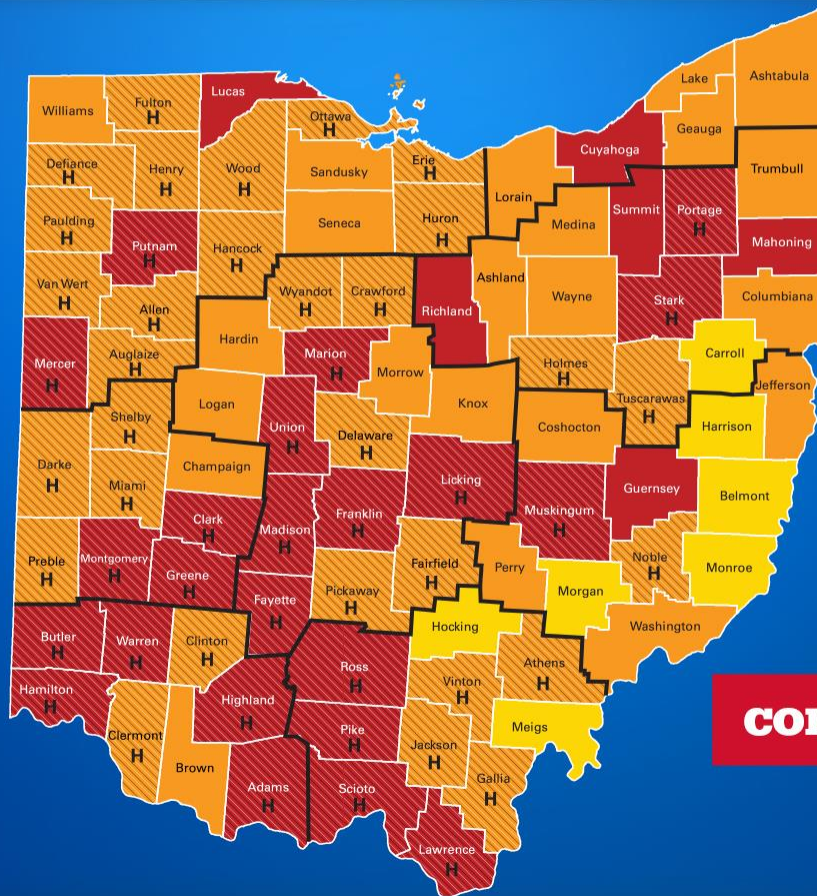
Public Emergency

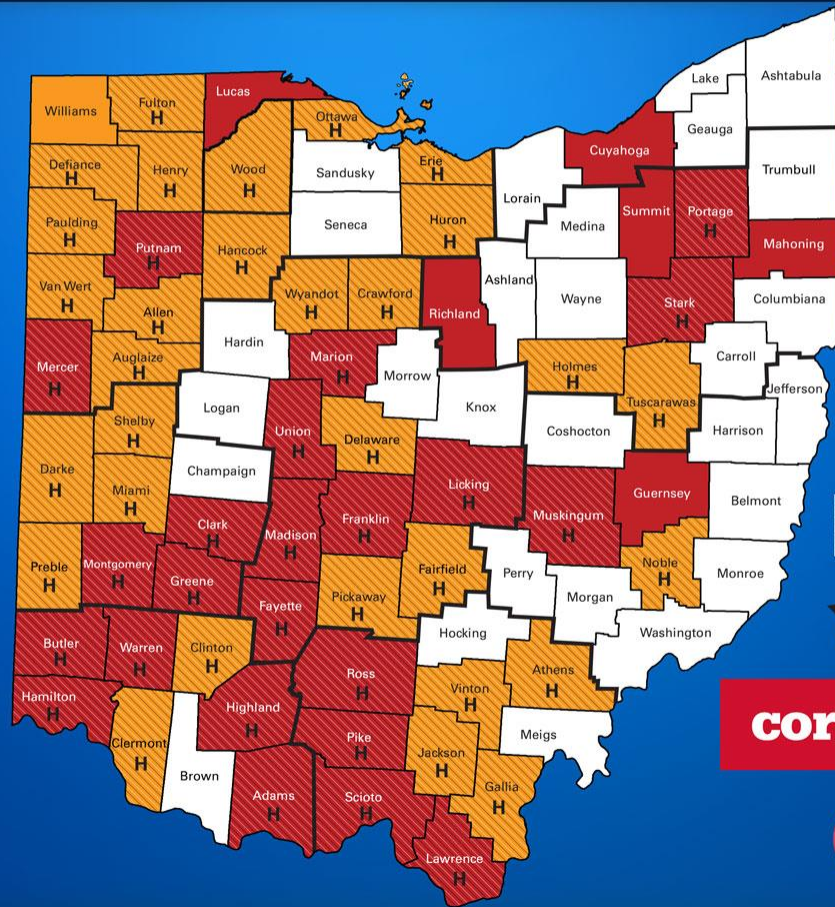

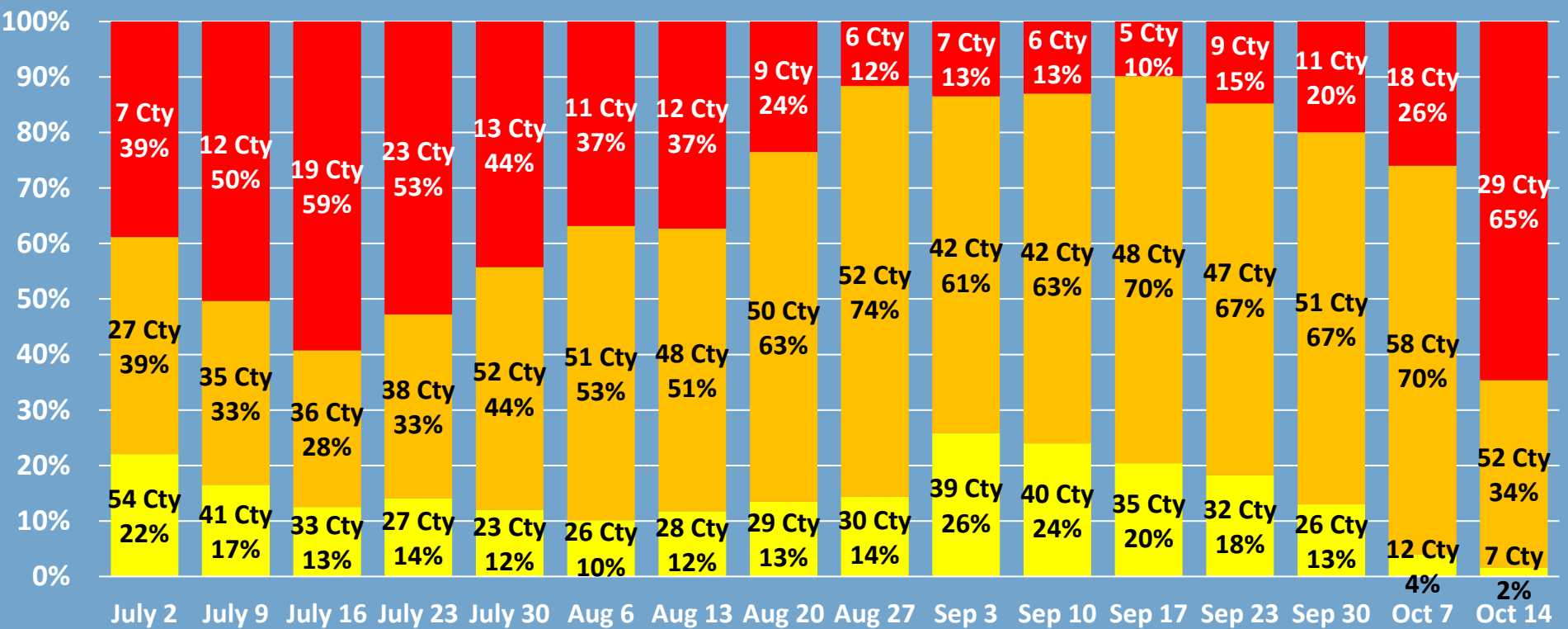
